Approval of April Minutes

Golf Advisory Committee Minutes May 11, 2020

Present: Chris Sykes, Daryl Blevins, Bob Brunetti, Rose Howard, Craig Andrews, Ron Coles, Kristin Farrington, Sue English-Kover POA, Wells McClure, Jordon Clark, Jon North and other Committee Liaison.

Absent: Howard Higby.

The meeting was called to order by Chris Sykes at 3:30 PM. Due to the Covid-19 virus this was a virtual meeting over Zoom. Chris conducted the meeting from his office at Toqua.

The April meeting of the committee was cancelled due to Covid-19. The committee approved the use of Chris Sykes April report as it's April minutes.

Chris announced that by agreement the GAC meeting will now be held on the second Monday of each month.

Rounds report.

Member rounds for April were 8,251 which is 1,129 over budget, however guest rounds were 384 under budget. Year to date member rounds are 973 over budget while guest rounds are 167 under budget. It should be noted that afternoon unlimited rounds year to date are 2,599.

Financials.

Even though rounds are up for the year revenue for April was \$30,381.92 under budget and year to date revenue is \$19,286.17. under budget. Factors contributing to the shortfall are loss of guest

rounds, loss of outside group play, merchandise sales and loss of cart revenue.

On the expense side, however expenses for April were \$71,519 71 under budget. Expenses year to date are \$201,130.45 under budget resulting in a year to date net income of \$181,844.38

Capital Requests.

The committee unanimously approved the request to purchase a Trackman for teaching and golf club fitting and the purchase of a tractor and rough mover for Tanasi.

Golf team and transitions update.

Chris then reported the following. Mike Leadbetter has been hired as an Assistant Golf Professional at Tanasi. The golf team has performed tremendously under the present circumstances. That a plan is being worked on to develop Goals and Objectives for each course, based on the present circumstances and the hopeful return to normalcy in the future. Some goals will be to create a Par 3 course inside each course, beginner programs and clinics.

The golf shops are now open on a limited basis and two persons may ride in a golf cart, however if any wants a single cart it will be provided.

Golf rates and strategies for 2021 will be formulated in the coming months.

A new golf events calendar has been created moving most events to the fall, including new dates for the Lions Club event, the Smokey Mountain Service Dogs, the Men's and Ladies Member-Member and Member-Guest.

Approval of April Minutes – continue

The Golf team will be working with the Marketing Department to include more golf information in the Newsletter, a talk show on golf will air on Tellico TV in the near future. The golf brochure and website have been updated.

Golf Course updates.

Jon North Assistant at Toqua reported the course is in overall good condition. The greens have recovered from the aerification and the Bermuda grass has started to grow.

Wells reported that Tanasi also is in good condition, the bunkers on 12 and 13 should be finished shortly and the crew will be starting on the cart paths that need repair.

Jordon reported much the same at Kahite. In 2019 Jordon and Bill Bergin golf course architect identified 32 bunkers for removal. Seventeen were removed in 2019. To date 14 of the remaining 15 have been filled in. The last one to go will the front bunker on number 12. The final shaping and sodding should be completed by summer.

Bill Bergin of Bergin Golf will soon be providing a preliminary plan for the renovation of the remaining bunkers along with a plan for some new or repositioned bunkers.

All three courses noted that increased cart traffic due to the oneperson cart rule has inhibited the growth of the fairway grass. Overall all three courses have come through winter and an unusually wet spring in good condition. **Beautification Committee**

Chris reported that to date \$3,080 has been collection through donations which is about half of the amount generated by the golf tournament. There is still a possibility of the tournament being rescheduled in the fall.

Kristin reported that the Butterfly garden has been completed at Kahite, and the ones at Toqua and Tanasi are still a work in progress.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 4:40 PM

Phase 1 - 5/31 - 8 a.m. start w/ 10 min intervals and a sporadic starter time to keep us from running out of carts gave us 63 tee time slots per course

Phase 2 - 6/1 - 7:30 a.m. start w/ 8&9 min intervals gave us 78 tee time slots per course that in essence affords up to 60 more individual tee times per day, per course.

Tellico Village Golf Operations Update - 5/31/2020

First and foremost, we want to thank the entire golf community for keeping golf <u>a safe haven</u> in Tellico Village.

We are excited to announce the Board of Directors has approved **Phase 2 COVID-19 Golf Operations**, which will go into effect on Monday, June 1st. The primary changes are related to Golf Shop operations and golf carts.

Golf Shop Operations

We will be reopening the golf shop lobbies for check-in and retail shopping in adherence with state guidelines.

- We ask that you stay home if you have any COVID-19 symptoms or have been exposed to anyone with COVID-19 in the last 14-days.
- We encourage everyone to check-in via the golf shop, but we will still be able to process via telephone.
- As a convenience and social distancing precaution, all league play will be automatically checked-in prior to your round unless you cancel in advance.
- Traffic flow please enter the golf shop through the main clubhouse entrance and exit through the golf shop side door.
- Social Distancing please abide by all postings and placards.
- > We will continue to disinfect all touch points. Sanitizing stations are available at all locations.
- Golf shop merchandise will continue to be marketed via social media and on the www.golftellicovillage.com.
- > Golf shop purchases can be made online or via telephone with delivery options available.



Golf Carts

- We have fabricated and installed a barrier system in the golf carts so we can most effectively and safely return to two-persons per cart. These dividers can be pinned up or rolled up for storage; please see a member of the golf staff to adjust up or down.
- Two persons per cart will lead to more tee time availability and therefore a greater likelihood of fulfilling tee time requests.
- We will also continue to afford the option of a solo cart for a modest surcharge of \$5 per nine holes.
 - o Carts are still first come first serve.
 - o Private carts are exempt.
 - o Does not apply to second cart in a threesome.
- > We will continue to disinfect golf carts prior to use. Divot bottles and scorecards will be placed back on the golf carts and disinfected accordingly.

Additional

- Shotgun starts guidelines now allow for groups of up to 50 persons so we will carefully bring back shotgun starts taking social distancing into consideration.
- Range balls we will be shifting back to a token system to be placed in baskets, all of which will be disinfected between users.
- All non-essential items will remain off the golf course to remove any unnecessary touch points for the time being.

Tellico Village is home to three of the most beautiful and challenging championship golf courses in East Tennessee. All three courses were designed by the prestigious firm of Ault, Clark, and Associates, architects of some of America's greatest courses.

TOQUA GOLF COURSE

Toqua is a beautiful golf course cut through a forest on Tellico Lake. You have everything from tree-lined holes to a links setting on the lake. The genius of the course is that it is playable for all levels of golfers.

The Toqua course offers a driving range, short-game practice area and practice putting green. It has a brand-new clubhouse that opened in 2019, as well as a pavilion that is used for torumaments, banquets, and other large gatherings and events. The new clubhouse features a Colf IP or Shop and sports barthemed restaurant that provides a spacious veranda for post-play food and refreshments.

Toqua has hosted numerous Tennessee Golf Association events—including the 2005 Senior Association events—including the 2009, 2011 and 2018 Four-Ball Championships and the 2009, 2011, and

2017 Senior Four-Ball Championships—as well as the 2008, 2009, and 2010 PGA Tour Nationwide Knoxville Open Qualifier.

TANASI GOLF COURSE

Tanasi was the second of the Tellico Village courses to open. It has a fun and contemporary layout that winds through the Tanasi neighborhood, and even has some holes that run over and alongside parts of Tellico Lake.

Tanasi offers options for players of all ages and skillsets, as well as a selection of tees to best fit your game. Our Black Championship tees measure 6,731 yards, while our yellow tees offer a fun short course at 4,486 yards. Tanasi is a fun course to play with wide fairways, large flat landing areas and big undulating greens.

Tanasi also has an expansive putting green with large undulations that mimic the greens you will encounter throughout the golf course. The Tanasi Clubhouse includes an excellent restaurant that offers casual dining with beautiful views of Tellico Lake. The wrap-around porch invites you to relax and enjoy the spectacular lake and golf course view while you dine.

THE LINKS AT KAHITE

Opened in 2002, the Links at Kahite is Tellion Villages hidden gem in Vonore, Th. The golf course is surrounded by Tellion Lake and offers breathtaking, panaramic views of the Great Smoky Mountains. It sits on over 200 acres of property and offers a variety of turfgrass species that adds difficulty and beauty on every hole. Kahite has six sets of tees that play from 7,170 yards to 4,435 yards to provide a variety of options and difficulty while making the experience from and challenging.

Kahite features a practice facility that includes a driving range and practice putting green. The Kahite Pub & Grill offers casual dining and an outdoor patio with a great view.

In 2003, the Links at Kahite was nominated by Golf Digest as best new private course and has since hosted many Tennessee Golf Association events, including the 2009 and 2011 Four-Ball and Senior Four-Ball Championships, as well as the 2009 and 2010 PGA Tour Nationwide Open Qualifler.
